Election Process

Voting will use the internet application Election Runner. Links to all ballots will be on the district website and require ID and Key credentials for delegates to vote. Alternate delegates will be given the credentials of the delegate they are seated to replace. Delegate credentials for both NMI and NYI are included in the church packet provided at the registration desk in the foyer. Kiosks for voting and support in case of trouble are also available in the foyer.

The ballots must be approved via a floor vote before voting can begin. Ballot summaries will be presented for approval. The time for voting will be announced from the platform. If the initial vote does not result in a clear decision, a run-off ballot will be announced from the platform.

To vote delegates need to open the convention details website entering the URL below or scanning the QR code to the right. On the site are links to both NMI and NYI ballots. Click or tap the link to access the ballot. Election Runner will prompt for the ID and Key provided in the church packet that identify you as a voting delegate. Delegates eligible to vote in both NMI and NYI elections should pick one ballot link then return to the web site and use the other link.

4. Mission Involvement for Teens and Children – Provide opportunities for teens and children to become involved in specific mission activities and respond to God's call.
5. World Evangelism Fund – Meet or exceed the WEF obligation.
6. Alabaster – Provide for buildings to be used to serve others.
7. Care and Connection – Pray for and support your assigned missionary.

Make an Impact - Locally and Globally

NMI focuses on five strategic areas where the local church can have maximum impact on missions in the Church of the Nazarene.

The first is **PRAYER**. NMI gathers believers together for prayer in the local church, linking us to our brothers and sisters in Christ across the globe.

The second is the **WORLD EVANGELISM FUND**, which fuels the Church of the Nazarene's mission by combining gifts from each person and church to fund ministries everywhere.

Through the **ALABASTER OFFERING**, the third emphasis, ministries around the world receive funds to purchase property and buy or build buildings.

The fourth is to **ENGAGE CHILDREN AND YOUTH** through education and fostering calls to missions.

CARE and CONNECTION, the last area of emphasis, strategically connects Nazarene missionaries and Nazarene churches through prayer, personal contact, and generous giving.

"Ukraine Crisis Response Fund" - See Page 14 #3

[Portions copied from ncm.org/ukraine-crisis] The ongoing invasion of Ukraine by a neighboring world power that began February 24, 2022, has displaced millions of residents from their homes. The number of Ukrainians living as refugees in other countries has swelled into the millions. Meanwhile, the number of internally displaced Ukrainians—those who have fled their homes but remain in the country—is just as high. Altogether, more than 14 million people have fled their homes in Ukraine. This war has caused the fastest forced population movement since World War II.

With your help, Nazarene missionaries, pastors, and volunteers are partnering with Nazarene Compassionate Ministries to help displaced people travel to safe areas, secure shelter, and acquire food and supplies. All over the world, churches and districts are responding with compassion for the Ukrainian people. You are a part of that compassionate response.

Crisis Care Kit Instructions

Gather **NEW** items in quantities listed below. (Include **only those items listed** below. **Deviating from this list can cause an entire shipment to be rejected in customs**).

Pack contents below into a clear 2-gallon plastic Ziploc bag:

1 medium-size bottle of shampoo (12-18 oz.), please tape tops closed	
1 medium toothpaste (4.0-6.4 oz.) (expiration at least 6 months in the future)	
3 toothbrushes (in original packaging or with covers)	
2 bars of soap (bath-size)	1 box of Band-Aids (30 or more)
1 fingernail clipper	1 sturdy hair comb
2 hand towels (not wash cloths)	4 pocket-size packages of facial tissue
1 Beanie Baby-size stuffed toy	

You will need to obtain one standard sized Banana Box for every six kits you pack. (Many stores will save them for you. Ask them not to cut the lids.) Cover the openings in the bottom and top of the box with brown paper (usually found in the box) or with plain cardboard. Fill each box with six (6) CCKs--no more.

Distinguished Service Award (DSA)

A DSA is given to those who have given exemplary service. Although the DSA is administered through NMI, they can be given to anyone serving in the church. The \$125 submitted for each DSA is used to support Missionary Health Care.

CCK/School Pal-Pak Collection

South Central Ohio district responded to the call for Crisis Care Kits in 2022! The Russian invasion of Ukraine displaced people. We responded to an emergency call from the Fawn Grove Compassion Center by mobilizing our district to collect CCKs at last year's convention. We put together 1,686 CCKs and partnered with the East Ohio and South West Ohio districts to ship a total of 4,620 kits to Fawn Grove in April.

For our normal October shipment, we put together another 1,476 CCKs and 350 School Pal Paks. East Ohio, South West Ohio, North West Ohio and North Central Ohio partnered with us to ship a total of 5,274 CCKs and 1,970 SPPs. In both shipments, Walmart stepped in to provide trucks and drivers to get these shipments to Fawn Grove at a minimal cost to all of the partner districts.

The recent earthquake impacting Syria and Turkey has again emptied the Fawn Grove facility. We are once again collecting CCKs at our convention and again in the fall. Regardless of when your boxes are collected, please include a sheet of paper attached to the outside listing your name, church, contact information and a brief inventory (# CCKs, # SPPs). Don't forget to provide funds for shipping (page 14 #2) and warehousing (page 14 #6).

Care and Connection

The traditional Links (Loving Interested Nazarenes Knowing and Sharing) program has changed its name to "**Care and Connection**". This change began in 2022 and 2023 will complete the transition. Starting in 2024, new missionary assignments are expected at the beginning of each calendar year.

The South Central Ohio district has three Care and Connection missionary assignments, Linda Russell (Eurasia North Field, retired as of January 2023), and our own retired missionaries, Brenda Gould (Africa) and Frances Collins (Brazil).

While the terminology and timing has changed, the goals of loving, caring, and connecting with missionaries is unchanged and represents a key factor in being a Missions Priority One church. That means all of the following are still recommended!

- Write your missionaries and assure them of your prayers, asking for personal requests.
- Send remembrances for special days like birthdays, anniversaries, and holidays. Remember surface mail takes quite a while to arrive in some locations, so plan accordingly.
- Children and youth find it especially meaningful to become personally acquainted with a missionary or a missionary's child. Encourage young people to send cards, small gifts, pictures, videos, and audio materials to your church's missionaries.
- See if your missionaries can use Skype, Facetime, or Zoom and have a church chat.

Financial gifts to active missionaries should be handled according to item #6 on page 14. Financial gifts to retired missionaries cannot be sent this way but should be sent directly to the missionary.

9. That each local council have several handbooks (available from the Nazarene Publishing House in hardcopy or e-book).
10. That each church fully support our missionaries by attendance and offerings when they are doing deputation in the churches. Make check payable to **Global Treasury Services** and give directly to the missionary.

NMI Finance Committee

The NMI Finance Committee recommends the following:

 - Sunday AM Service ----- \$400

 - Faith Promise ----- \$1,000The deputation check is made payable to Global Treasury Services and is given directly to the missionary, as the missionary must also keep record of deputation offerings received.
