Mission Call Coordinator

The Mission Call Coordinator's (MCC) primary role is to guide and support young people professing a call to ministry. The MCC is the district (NMI & NYI) contact person for a call to ministry, providing youth, pastors, mentors, and churches with resources, encouragement, and direction from call to fulfillment. The Purpose of the MCC is to promote and organize yearly events to equip and lead teens into a peer-to-peer relationship and fellowship. The goal is to nurture a culture of call, mission, and ministry within the district as it pertains to young people. Within the SCO district, Rev. Sam Simoes, pastor of the Columbus Northwest church, fills the MCC role.

"Helping end Human Trafficking" - See Page 14 #3

Human trafficking is a form of modern-day slavery that enables people to profit from the control and exploitation of others. It's a crime in which both children and adults are bought and sold into forced labor or commercial sexual exploitation through force, fraud, or coercion. Human trafficking dehumanizes people, turning them into commodities. It is a global problem that affects people in every country in the world. Traffickers prey on individuals who are vulnerable. Situations including poverty, homelessness, family breakdown, societal exclusion, disasters, and conflict are some of the factors that create vulnerabilities to trafficking.

Around the world,

- There are 40.3 million victims of human trafficking
- a large percent of those people are trafficked for labor and are forced to produce goods like chocolate, coffee, shoes, textiles, and more
- Victims of human trafficking include women, men, girls, and boys, and they cross all racial, ethnic, socio-economic, and educational backgrounds

Nazarene Compassionate Ministries partners with local churches in anti-trafficking efforts that range from awareness and education campaigns to prevention efforts that lower individuals' risk of being trafficked to protection and care for victims of trafficking, like Shechem.

As a member of the Wesleyan Holiness Consortium, the Church of the Nazarene helped to craft and has endorsed a Declaration for Freedom, and NCM's anti-trafficking work aligns with this declaration.

5. World Evangelism Fund – Meet or exceed the WEF obligation.
6. Alabaster – Provide for buildings to be used to serve others.
7. Care and Connection – Pray for and support your assigned missionary.

Make an Impact - Locally and Globally

NMI focuses on five strategic areas where the local church can have maximum impact on missions in the Church of the Nazarene.

The first is **PRAYER**. NMI gathers believers together for prayer in the local church, linking us to our brothers and sisters in Christ across the globe.

The second is the **WORLD EVANGELISM FUND**, which fuels the Church of the Nazarene's mission by combining gifts from each person and church to fund ministries everywhere.

Through the **ALABASTER OFFERING**, the third emphasis, ministries around the world receive funds to purchase property and buy or build buildings.

The fourth is to **ENGAGE CHILDREN AND YOUTH** through education and fostering calls to missions.

CARE and CONNECTION, the last area of emphasis, strategically connects Nazarene missionaries and Nazarene churches through prayer, personal contact, and generous giving.

Crisis Care Kit Instructions

Gather **NEW** items in quantities listed below. (Include **only those items listed** below. ***Deviating from this list can cause an entire shipment to be rejected in customs.***)

Pack contents below into a clear 2-gallon plastic Ziploc bag:

1 medium-size bottle of shampoo (12-18 oz.), please tape tops closed	
1 medium toothpaste (4.0-6.4 oz.) (expiration at least 18 months in the future)	
3 toothbrushes (in original packaging or with covers)	
2 bars of soap (bath-size)	1 box of Band-Aids (30 or more)
1 fingernail (not toenail) clipper	1 sturdy hair comb
2 hand towels (not wash cloths)	4 pocket-size packages of facial tissue
1 Beanie Baby-size stuffed toy (3-5 in.)	

You will need to obtain one standard sized Banana Box for every six kits you pack. (Many stores will save them for you. Ask them not to cut the lids.) Cover the openings in the bottom and top of the box with brown paper (usually found in the box) or with plain cardboard. Fill each box with six (6) CCKs--no more.

Distinguished Service Award (DSA)

A DSA is given to those who have given exemplary service. Although the DSA is administered through NMI, they can be given to anyone serving in the church. The \$125 submitted for each DSA is used to support Missionary Health Care.

CCK/School Pal-Pak Collection

Over the past two years we have had CCK/SPP collection at both our spring convention and in the fall. Both times there was a need for the kits, however there has been a negative impact. The additional shipping times have lowered our volume per shipment below the level needed to allow Walmart to bless us with transportation. Since Walmart's assistance significantly impacts our shipping costs, we are returning to a single collection and shipment in the fall.

We had 706 Crisis Care Kits and 174 School Pal Paks collected during our fall collection campaign. We also had a great team to audit the collected kits. Unfortunately, auditing the kits is necessary as any deviation from the inventory list can cause an entire container shipment to be blocked by customs.

Kits can still be dropped off during camp meeting. The kits collected over the summer will sit in storage until the collection drive in the fall, so the extra months before expiration are needed!

Collection dates for 2024 will be September 14th, 21st, and 28th.

Care and Connection

The traditional LINKS (Loving Interested Nazarenes Knowing and Sharing) program has changed its name to "**Care and Connection**". This change began in 2022 and 2023 completed the transition. As of 2024, new missionary assignments are expected at the beginning of each calendar year and are communicated via email shortly after the new year.

The South Central Ohio district has two active missionary assignments, Martin & Cezi Glendenning (Croatia) and Stephen & Rebecca Barber (Thailand), and our own retired missionaries, Brenda Gould (Africa) and Frances Collins (Brazil).

While the terminology and timing has changed, the goals of loving, caring, and connecting with missionaries is unchanged and represents a key factor in being a Missions Priority One church. That means all of the following are still recommended!

- Email your missionaries and assure them of your prayers, asking for personal requests.
- Send remembrances for special days like birthdays, anniversaries, and holidays. Remember surface mail takes quite a while to arrive in some locations, so plan accordingly.
- Children and youth find it especially meaningful to become personally acquainted with a missionary or a missionary's child. Encourage young people to send cards, small gifts, pictures, videos, and audio materials to your church's missionaries.
- See if your missionaries can use Skype, Facetime, or Zoom and have a church chat.

Financial gifts to active missionaries should be handled according to item #6 on page 14. Gifts to retired missionaries cannot be sent this way but should be sent directly to the missionary.

They consider themselves blessed and fortunate to be able to be a part of what God is doing in Croatia and Central Europe in general!

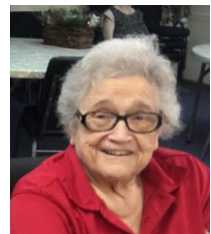

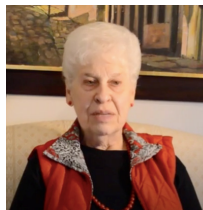

NMI Finance Committee

The NMI Finance Committee recommends the following:

1. That each church fully support our missionaries by attendance and offerings when they come on deputation assignment. The following are recommended minimums based on the type of service.
 - Sunday AM Service ----- \$400
 - Sunday PM Service ----- \$250
 - Weekday Service ----- \$225
